



# CDNA Representative Player Code of Behaviour

When representing Caulfield & District Netball Association as a Representative player, the following code of behaviour is an expectation of the Association and must be adhered to at all times.

- Ensure the standards of the *Fair Play Code* are applied by demonstrating the five core values that will lead to Fair Play for all – Integrity, Respect, Responsibility, Fairness and Safety
- Play by the rules.
- Never argue with an official. If you disagree, have your captain approach the official during a break or after competition.
- Control your temper. Verbal abuse of officials, players or deliberately distracting or provoking another opponent is not acceptable or permitted.
- Be a good sport. Acknowledge all good plays whether they are made by your team or the opposition.
- Participate for your own enjoyment and benefit.
- Cooperate with your coach, team mates and opponents. Without them, there would be no competition.
- Show respect for your team, officials and your opponents.
- Support all efforts to remove verbal and physical abuse.
- Recognise and respect the value and importance of volunteer committee members, officials, administrators and coaches. They give up their time and resources to provide recreational activities for players and deserve your support.
- Comply with the Netball Victoria Child Safe Safety Standards
- Display control, respect and professionalism to all involved with the sport. This includes opponents, coaches, officials, administrators, parents / spectators.
- Respect the rights, dignity and worth of all participants regardless of their gender, ability, sexuality, cultural background or religion.
- Ensure when playing in domestic competitions that your behaviour is beyond reproach

Breaching the conditions of this Code of Behaviour may be regarded as misconduct, which may result in disciplinary action.
